



Sauna Haus

Starting a fire:

- To warm up the Sauna Haus or enjoy the Sauna, start a fire.
- If you're not taking a sauna and want more heat in the Sauna Haus, prop the Sauna room door to allow heat from the stove to circulate to the main room.
- Place paper, cardboard pieces and smaller wood pieces to make a starter fire.
- Empty the ash tray (outside) and leave it open a bit to let air in.
- Light paper and close the stove door, but open the wheel a bit for ongoing wood burning.
- After a fire gets going, pack the stove full of wood and close the ash tray, but leave the wheel opened.
- Adjust the tray to wheel opening to maintain the fire level
- Be sure to have the sauna door closed to for heating making a good sauna.
- The sauna will be up to temp in about 1 hour depending on the Sauna Haus temperature. Check the temp and stock the stove with wood accordingly.

Maintaining a fire:

- As the Sauna Haus comes to temp both day and night, pack the stove with wood and tamp the tray and wheel completely once the firebox is hot.
- Check the fire occasionally, if fire is dying out, add one or two logs at a time. You can adjust the wheel to help air flow.
- if you are having issues controlling temp, use the space heater.

Sauna

- Rule 1: Do not heat Sauna past 200 Degrees!!!!
- Rule 2: Don't use more wood than necessary.
- Leave wet towels to dry in the sauna. Take to laundry to wash before leaving.
- Be kind to anyone sleeping in the loft – Heat and voices rise.

According to Todd the perfect Sauna temp is 90° Celsius (195° Fahrenheit) This is a stoking hot sauna and higher than most people are used to. For a more relaxing sauna look to 165-175° Fahrenheit (80° Celsius).

Sleeping in the Sauna Haus

- The bed in the loft is clean and ready for use.
- Open a window near the bed to cool the space if needed.
- Staying one night – consider sleeping on top the bed so you don't have to wash everything before you leave.



Check out

- Leave it cleaner than you found it.
- Restock firewood (some wood is stored under the eave of the Sauna Haus)
- Gather and take towels to laundry to wash
- Sweep floors
- Wipe down counters
- Clean any appliances used
- Wash sink
- Turn off fan and all lights
- Turn the space heater off in summer and down to 2 when leaving in the winter. Any lower and the water pipe will freeze.
- Prop the Sauna door open to allow airflow to avoid water pipe freezing.
- Take out the garbage
- One last walk/look around for personal items!!!
- Make sure all windows are closed and the doors are locked.
