



Welcome!

EndPoint is a construction zone so bear with us. We want this to be a fun place where we all can enjoy each other and the beautiful forest all around us. So, first rule is **Enjoy yourself when you are here!**

We go by the philosophies of our camping days in the Northwoods; pack it in and pack it out and leave the space cleaner than you found it. It's really appreciated when everyone chips in and does their part to keep EndPoint ready for the next round of guests.

FYI:

- Wifi: up north der – password: wayupnorth
- Music: We have a Sonos music system. Download the app for streaming any music service in the main lodge or saunahaus.
 - Speakers for the lodge are present both inside and outdoors just outside on the patio. *Try to be cognizant of the outdoor volume.*
 - Volume controls are nobs on the wall. The control nob for the main lodge is on the wall by the dining room table under the speakers. The control nob for the outside speakers on the wall of the breakfast nook.
- TV instructions: There is an Amazon Fire Stick and Google Chromecast. You can use the smaller control to turn the tv on and find a streaming channel. If issues, use the regular remote to select the source (either HDM1 or HDM2).
 - Many streaming services are already installed and an account logged in.

Arriving:

Things to do upon arrival:

- Summer time: Only open doors/windows that have screens. And only if not too humid or hot. The lodge does a great job of keeping th building cool.
- Use the big ass fans on the ceiling to circulate air. Remotes are around.
- Winter time: Fill the humidifier in wintertime– located by the dryer. Keeps static in hair down. There is an on/off knob. IT takes about 20 seconds to fill. If it overflows, you'll see water on the floor.

Outside:

- The fire pit should have supplies if a fire is desired. Keep an eye on it!
- If you want to use the boat or snowmobiles, or other motorized rides, please consider donating to the gas fund
- You will definitely want bug spray during early summer!
- Check water level of the lake before diving in. Lake is very low currently!

**Lodge Bedrooms:**

- This is a make your own bed place. Clean bedding has been left by the previous guest or bring your own.
- Staying a night or two? – consider sleeping on top the bed (bring a sleeping bag!) so you don't have to wash everything before you leave.

Main Lodge:

- Never leave candles or lanterns burning unattended!
 - Related note: Fire extinguishers are located throughout the main lodge, and one near the fire place and one by the wood pile in the saunahaus. There are a few attached to posts (they are white) and there is one in the kitchen behind the toaster oven (red).
- The lodge uses a septic system. There are constraints associated with this system. It is best to be gentle when possible.
 - Do not flush tampons.
 - "If it's yellow, leave it mellow. If it's brown flush it down."
 - Do not pour any chemical down the sink or toilet without checking with Todd or Rylee.
 - Winter time: Notice a weird smell? The shower drains in the downstairs (future) bathrooms might need water to plug up the gasses coming from the septic system.

Masonry Fireplace:

Todd will fill in here

- Do not attempt to start a fire without instruction from Todd.
- Restock the firewood used from the wood pile in the carport.

Kitchen:

- There is a large commercial Vulcan gas range. Do not attempt to light unless trained by Todd
- There are also two induction stove tops for cooking.
- There are two waste bins in the kitchen. One is recyclables that can be mixed – cans, glass and plastic jugs. The other is for waste that is not food scraps, paper or other recyclables.
 - Take any food scraps to the outdoor compost bin in summer (blue drum east of house) – Winter – compost goes into regular garbage.
- Do not tempt hungry bears in Spring/Early Summer by leaving garbage outside. Bears love the challenge of opening up the garbage bins. Best advice, keep garbage inside while visiting and take the garbage and recyclables home
- Start a recycle box or bag for all paper items (paper napkins, plates, cardboard, etc... These are great fire-starters for the fireplace, sauna fire or outside firepit.
- Feel free to use any of the pantry items. If you use the last of something (or supply is precariously low), please let Rylee or Todd know so supplies can be replenished.

Laundry

- The washing machine "speed" cycle (30 minutes) gets the job done for all but dirtiest clothing. (If you put it on sanitize, you will be sitting around all day waiting for the load to finish.)



- This washing machine handles a good-sized load – 2 sets of queen bed sheets, and a couple of towels will fit.
- Put one Tide pod in the washer.
- Clean the lint trap (inside the dryer) before using. Use one Bounce sheet.
- Please fold and put away any clean sheets and towels before leaving.

Cleaning:

- See the Check-out list!
- Cleaning supplies are in the utility room.
- Do not put any chemicals down the sink. This is really bad for our septic system. Talk with Todd if not sure.
- Dish washing currently is done in the utility room. All supplies are near the sink.
